



Thanks to the generosity of our community, 2023 was the Foundation's most successful philanthropic year to date! We raised over \$2.5 million in support of Sno-Isle Libraries, which includes the largest bequest in our history and more than \$700,000 in contributions from individuals, businesses, and foundations. We are grateful to our incredible supporters for believing in the power of libraries to change lives and helping us reach this milestone.

We received a transformational \$1.8 million bequest from the estate of John and Betty Parks to benefit future capital upgrades of the Snohomish Library. As you think about the legacy you want to create for your community, we encourage you to consider including the Foundation in your estate plans to ensure public libraries continue to thrive and serve as cornerstones of democracy for future generations.

We expanded our Foundation Board of Directors with eight new members who bring a wealth of skills and experience and represent diverse communities within the Library District.

Our Library Giving Day, GiveBIG, and end-of-year campaigns raised a record \$168,000, and we welcomed 400 new donors to the Sno-Isle Libraries family of supporters.

The Foundation provided \$140,000 for the remodel of the Darrington Library and annual lease support for the Mariner and Lakewood/Smokey Point Libraries; supported Sno-Isle Libraries' first-ever Pride Book & Resource Fairs in Langley offering LGBTQIA+ books and resources; and, secured a four-year \$100,000 grant from Education First's Limitless Network, supported by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, to help advance post-secondary student enrollment in the Oak Harbor School District in partnership with Skagit Valley College, Oak Harbor Public Schools, and Sno-Isle Libraries.

Because of the exceptional generosity of supporters like you, the Foundation has committed to doubling its funding of essential library programs and services we'll be supporting in 2024. In addition to staple early literacy programs, such as Third Graders Read Together and Summer Reading, we will provide funding for World Languages Storytimes, Prime Time family programming, youth and adult online programs, Author Talks, Sno-Isle Reads Together, Discover Passes, intergenerational programs, and many other exciting programs and activities across the District.

Your support has had a positive impact on our community. As the scope and work of the Foundation continue to grow, we look forward to our continued partnership with Sno-Isle Libraries and you – our supporters – to ensure our community libraries remain inspiring and welcoming places for all residents of Snohomish and Island counties. Thank you for making a difference!



2023 Foundation Highlights



Fostering a Lifelong Love of Reading

The Foundation continued its support of **Third Graders Read Together**, Sno-Isle Libraries' partnership program with local schools, which encourages children to have fun and enjoy reading while honing their literacy and teamwork skills. The program uses books from the Washington Library Association's OTTER Award, whose motto is, "books kids like, not books adults think kids should like." The support from the Foundation helped provide 2,440 OTTER books to 65 schools and 4,200 third graders throughout the region.



The Foundation provided \$20,000 for Sno-Isle Libraries' **Summer Reading** program. The funding made it possible to distribute 1,800 prize books to participants at 15 Boys & Girls Club locations, provide prize books for program finishers at the Mariner, Lakewood/Smokey Point, Monroe, Mountlake Terrace, and Stanwood libraries, organize fun in-person activities, such as Encounter Dinosaurs with the Dinocrew! at the Snohomish Library, and online programs in partnership with community organizations, including the Museum of Flight, Deception Pass State Park, and Pacific NW Ballet. The 2023 theme was *All Together Now*, highlighting the power of libraries and reading to unite communities and people of all ages. Summer Reading had a record 6,477 readers with over 2.4 million minutes read!



Enriching the Sno-Isle Libraries Collection

We received an incredibly generous gift of \$125,000 from the Nysether Family Foundation to expand their existing endowment. Since 2007, the Nysether Family endowment, held with the Community Foundation of Snohomish County, has helped enhance our library collection. With support from the endowment, in 2023 we invested \$6,529 in new books and other materials with a focus on astronomy and space exploration. From "A Traveler's Guide to the Stars" and "Quantum Physics for Beginners," to "A Brief History of Black Holes" and "Hubble's Universe," this stellar new addition to the collection has a lot to offer for space enthusiasts and curious minds. Advancing Post-secondary Student Enrollment

The Foundation helped secure a \$100,000 Limitless Network grant (\$25,000 annually for the next four academic years) to help drive collaborative efforts between Skagit Valley College, Oak Harbor Public Schools, and Sno-Isle Libraries. This new initiative focuses on strengthening the pathway from high school to post-secondary education and improving post-secondary enrollment rates in the Oak Harbor School District with an emphasis on serving students facing significant barriers, including those from Black, Latino, and Indigenous communities, as well as students from low-income families and rural areas.



Investing in Inspiring Spaces

The Foundation invested \$50,000 for the remodel of our reimaged **Darrington Library** and helped fund the grand opening celebration. The library's remodeled space brings in the natural landscape from Whitehorse Mountain and the surrounding forest and features a barrier-free design with a welcoming entry, quiet reading places, designated children's area, and an outdoor space.

We continued to support the annual lease expenses for our demonstration libraries, providing \$50,000 to the **Lakewood/Smokey Point Library** and \$40,000 to the **Mariner Library**.



Commitment to Equity and Inclusion

In June, we celebrated Pride by helping launch Sno-Isle Libraries' first **Pride Book & Resource Fairs** on Whidbey Island. More than 200 residents attended the events and enjoyed free giveaway books with a focus on LGBTQIA+ authors, characters, and themes.

In August, the Foundation supported the annual **Mariner Fest**, a partnership between the Mariner Library, Hand in Hand, and community organizations, which provides back to school supplies and community resources to local families. Over 1,500 community members attended the fest and 750 K-12 students received much-needed backpacks and other supplies for the new school year.



Our In-Person Events are Back!

In October, over 50 Foundation supporters gathered at the Mukilteo Library for our in-person author salon with acclaimed poet Rena Priest, an enrolled member of the Lhaq'temish (Lummi) Nation and 2021-2023 Washington State Poet Laureate. Rena Priest presented "I Sing the Salmon Home: Poems from Washington State," a unique collection of poems from more than 150 Washington poets ranging from first graders to tribal elders, all inspired by the Northwest's beloved, iconic salmon.

The event was the perfect opportunity to celebrate outgoing board member Jackie DeFazio for her many years of service to the Foundation and Sno-Isle Libraries.


Creating a Legacy for Your Community


Shaping the Future of the Snohomish Library

In 2023, the Foundation received a transformational \$1.8 million bequest from the estate of philanthropists John & Betty Parks to benefit future capital upgrades of the Snohomish Library. Possible upgrades may include improvements to the building, modernizing the early learning area, and enhancing the library's outdoor spaces.

John & Betty Parks were longtime Snohomish residents and library patrons who cared deeply about their community. During their lifetime, they chose to set up a trust to ensure their wishes were fulfilled after their passing. Their forward-thinking gift will have a profound impact on the Snohomish community for generations to come.
